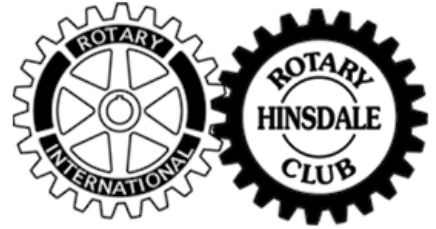

of Rotary International, in Evanston. The headquarters of RI always has been in the Chicago area. The first seven offices were located in downtown, but in 1954 Rotary built a new building in Evanston. This building met the needs of RI until the 1980s, when the addition of new programs, the growth of The Rotary Foundation, and the new PolioPlus activities made the headquarters extremely crowded. When a modern 18-story office building became available in Evanston in 1987, it appeared to meet all of Rotary's space and expansion needs. Built in 1977, it provides 400,000 square feet of office space.

The building provides a 190-seat auditorium, large parking garage, and 300-seat cafeteria, as well as functional office space for the 500 employees of the World Headquarters.

One Rotary Center, as it is called, enhances the efficient operations of RI, one of the largest not-for-profit service organizations in the world, with more than one million members actively participating in thousands of local clubs spread across 161 countries around the world. Rotary International provides its members with the opportunity to address such issues as AIDS, homelessness, polio, lack of education, hunger, and other national and international problems. Rotary International Foundation contributes nearly \$100 million every year toward humanitarian programs in which Rotary members participate and voluntarily raise funds.
