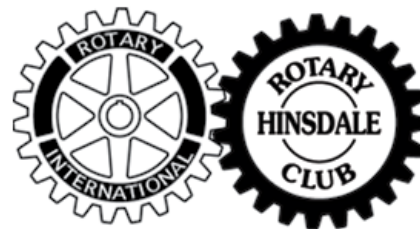

Invest Little Changes A Lot..

Worldwide, Rotary Foundation Matching Grants are saving and changing lives. Since the first Matching Grant was awarded in 1965, more than \$335 million has been distributed through more than 30,000 grants. This is a tremendous achievement for Rotarians, who have made these grants possible through their generous donations to the Annual Programs Fund, and dedicated their time and talent to help carry out projects that put Service Above Self. By giving \$100 a year -- less than \$2 a week -- to the Annual Programs Fund through the Every Rotarian, Every Year (EREY) initiative, Rotarians become part of the Foundation's mission to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.



In honor of Veteran's Day, the Naperville Rotary partnered with another service club to put 2009 flags on Rotary Hill located on the River Walk in downtown Naperville. Each flag has a name of a VET and was supported with a \$35 contribution with each flag.



Race chairman, Greg Donnelly congratulated all who contributed to the Race. Some statistics he shared with us; Over 5 years, during our relationship with Wellness House, the Race has raised over \$1.2 million. The Lane School won the Elementary school cup this year with 37% of the student population attending. In a close count, by virtually one student, Clarendon Hills Middle School took back the cup from HMS with a 12% student participation.
